

God's Will

Finding God's Will For Your Life

Always start with God's Word, which is very clear about his will in many areas!

God's will involves being set apart for His will and holiness. 1 Thess 4:3

Other important verses about God's will:

Micah 6:8 "He has showed you, O man, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God."

2 Peter 3:9 "The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. He is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance."

Isaiah 46:9-10 "Remember the former things, those of long ago;

I am God, and there is no other; I am God, and there is none like me. I make known the end from the beginning, from ancient times, what is still to come. I say: My purpose will stand, and I will do all that I please

Deuteronomy 29:29 "The secret things belong to the LORD our God, but the things revealed belong to us and to our children forever, that we may follow all the words of this law."

Ephesians 1:11, Matthew 10:29-30, Ps 139:16, John 2:15-17

We see God's will, Biblically, is made up of two parts:

- 1) God's will of decree – What God says will happen, whether we want it to or not. God is sovereign
- 2) God's will of desire – What God desires us to do, this part is up to us to fulfill

Most of the time we as believers wrongly look for God's will of direction. God does have a specific plan for your life. However, He does not require or ask that you find out that plan before you make decisions.

Sometimes believers feel more and more Spiritual the less and less they do. The statement "I'm just trying to find God's will" may be under the guise of instability, disobedience, lack of trust, or simply a misconception about God's will. 1Thess. 5:14

"expecting God to reveal some hidden will of direction is an invitation to disappointment and indecision"

“Trusting in God’s will of decree is good. Following His will of desire is obedient. Waiting for God’s will of direction is a mess.”

The Biblical way: “But seek first his kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things will be added to you as well.” Matt. 6:33
